Authors Inspire Readers at the Library Library to host variety of author events this season

The West Bloomfield Library is bringing stories to life with author events designed to spark conversation, celebrate creativity, and foster a lifelong love of reading.

From bestselling novels to award-winning children's books and local voices, these programs highlight the library's role as a center for learning and connection.

Shelby Van Pelt: A Bestseller Comes to Town



Remarkably Bright Creatures by Shelby Van Pelt is told from the perspective of a curmudgeonly octopus who forms a friendship with the woman who works the night shift at the aquarium. Together, they unravel the decades-old mystery of her missing son, transforming both their lives. **Van Pelt will visit the Berman Center on Wednesday, March 5 at 6:30 PM.**

Fans of *Remarkably Bright Creatures* won't want to miss an evening with *New York Times* bestselling author Shelby Van Pelt.

The debut novel, referred to by many as "that octopus book," has reappeared on the bestseller list multiple times since its release in 2022 and continues to rank among the library's top checkouts. It has been picked up by Netflix as a film and remains a favorite among local book clubs.

Diane Henderson, the Friends of the Library's BOOKTalk chair, initially read the book at her sister's recommendation.

"As someone who tracks fiction pretty closely, I was surprised I hadn't heard of it," Henderson said. "Then I read it. I fell in love. Yes—with a novel where one of the primary characters is an octopus and the other is an older widow."

Van Pelt will visit the Berman Center for the Performing Arts in a joint partnership between the West Bloomfield Township Public Library and Bloomfield Township Public Library on Wednesday, March 5 at 6:30 PM.

"Having the opportunity to hear Van Pelt talk about her journey to this novel would be amazing," Henderson said. "It was an unexpected bestseller. I would love to hear her talk about her writing process and her responses to its reception."

The event will feature a conversation with Van Pelt and Executive Library Director Cathy Russ, followed by a book signing. Registration opens January 6. Advanced registration is required, as seating is limited. Books will be available for purchase, provided by Schuler Books.

Local Author Fair: A Showcase of Talent

Back for its second year, the library's local author fair draws in readers of all ages. Authors at the fair represent a variety of genres—from nonfiction to fantasy—and come from different publishing backgrounds.

West Bloomfield resident Caroline Kerfoot participated in the library's first Local Author Fair in 2024. Kerfoot is the author-illustrator of *Adventures of Fox,* a series of children's rhyming picture books about kindness and friendship.

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"The West Bloomfield Library Local Author Fair is so much fun to participate in," said Kerfoot. "Both to connect with the community and fellow local authors!"

Young adult and children's book author Jean Alicia Elster also had a table at last year's event.

"For me, the value in participating in the West Bloomfield Library's Local Author Fair was two-fold," Elster said. "I made

meaningful connections with many people from the library's wonderful community of readers and book lovers. And I enjoyed the opportunity to spend time with the local author community, chatting with old friends and making new friends."

Award-Winning Authors Visit Schools

Each year, the library supports young readers by partnering with local public schools for reading programs culminating in author visits. This spring, celebrated children's author/illustrator Jarrett Lerner will visit elementary schools in West Bloomfield School District. Lerner is the creator of *EngiNerds, Geeger the Robot, The Hunger Heroes, Nat the Cat, A Work in Progress,* and activity books *Give This Book a Title* and *Give This Book a Cover.*

Meanwhile, at West Bloomfield Middle School and Bloomfield Hills' Lone Pine Elementary, the months-long reading programs will welcome visits from award-winning author Sarah Weeks. Weeks has written over 60 books for young readers, including *Pie, Save Me a Seat*, and *So B. It*—now a feature-length film.

On Monday, March 17 at 7 PM, Weeks will also stop by the Main Library to talk about her stories and writing process, including answering questions from the crowd. Students in grades 3-8 are encouraged to register for this event at wblib.org.

These upcoming author events support the library's mission by connecting authors and readers over the power of storytelling.


Language Learning at Your Library

If you're looking for a sign to learn sign language, this is it! West Bloomfield Library members can now learn ASL (()) () through the Mango Languages app.

The international language collection includes 1,389 books across 13 world languages. Korean books were added in 2022 after Census data indicated Korean was a top 10 language in the community.

Maker Events in the Community Commons



Thank you, West Bloomfield! The library millage proposal passed. This millage represents 42% of the library's overall funding, so we are very grateful for your support. It is a relief to know that we can move forward over the next 10 years with stable funding, continuing the library's tradition of excellence and service. In the short term, we plan to implement the 24/7 holds pickup lockers in 2025 and update all the self-checkout stations with new, accessible stations. For the long term, we are planning for capital, IT, and infrastructure improvements to both buildings. Watch this space for more information!
