This summer, the library is bringing the joy of reading to parks, schools, and neighborhoods throughout the community. The library will spread its "Color Our World" themed Summer Reading Program through partnerships with West Bloomfield Parks, Keego Harbor Parks, and local schools.

Families can join the library for **Storytimes at Fran Leaf Park**, hosted in collaboration with
Keego Harbor Parks each month.

In West Bloomfield, three sessions of **Library Live at Drake Sports Park** will bring magic and music to families with kids of all ages. At Keith Sports Park, a new **Summer Reading Soiree** on Thursday, July 17 from 4-7 PM aims to keep families excited about reading with a Jim Gill concert, big blue blocks, and more festivities.

The library will also have a presence at many favorite summer gatherings, including the

Keego Block Party and Summer on the Bank. As a member of the West Bloomfield Diversity Task Force, the library is involved in organizing Juneteenth Jamboree. The library is also a proud event partner with West Bloomfield Parks for the Kids Komotion concert series.

Inside local schools, learning continues with a creative twist. The library is partnering with the West Bloomfield School District to bring a lineup of engaging performers to Doherty Elementary School for **Shows at the School.**

Education professionals are also coming to the library this summer for **Rockin' Readers**— a series led by local educators to help K-5 students build reading skills—and **Summer Speech Worms**—a series for ages 3-10 facilitated by speech-language pathologists and funded by the Friends of the Library. Both series are designed to keep young minds sharp while having fun during summer break.

Mature minds will also enjoy a dose of Summer Reading magic, with Community Engagement Librarian Emily Tobin bringing programs directly to local senior residences.

Former Library Director Wins National Award

Clara Bohrer has been awarded the 2025 Joseph W. Lippincott Award through the American Library Association for distinguished service in the profession of librarianship. Bohrer served the West Bloomfield Library for 30 years in addition to her national library leadership and contributions.

Library and Affiliates Earn Accolades at Michigan Week



On Friday, May 9, leaders in service across the community gathered for the 53rd Annual Michigan Week celebration.

This year, West Bloomfield Township Public Library was honored with the Environmental Stewardship Award. The award recognizes exceptional education outreach or initiatives that protect and preserve the environment. Initiatives cited in the library's nomination for the award include the seed library, Citizen Science Kits, extensive programming, and Storybook Trail (a partnership with WB Parks).

The Friends of the West Bloomfield Library was recognized with the Community Achievement Award, which honors community-based organizations for an endeavor that works to improve the quality of life for all. The Friends' fundraising activities, their organization of cultural programs, and their commitments to early childhood literacy and lifelong learning were cited in nomination materials.

Additionally, Ken Macon was awarded the Lifetime Leadership Award in recognition of long-term leadership to the library and community at large. Macon served on the library board for 16 years before retiring in November 2024.

For years of dedicated volunteerism to the library, Clementine Goodman was recognized with the Michigan Treasures Honor Roll Award.



Main Library Closure

Saturday, August 16 - Sunday, August 24

The Main Library will close mid-August to replace the carpet in the Adult Services area and surrounds. The current carpeting in this area is 17 years old and well-trodden. A weeklong closure is necessary to move books, shelving, study carrels, desks, and equipment. The Drive-Up Window and Westacres Branch will remain open.

During the closure, materials in the Main Adult and Young Adult stacks may not be readily available. Stock up before these titles are safely stored during the carpeting project.

Computer Updates Are Coming

Microsoft will stop supporting Windows 10 on October 14, 2025. To keep public computers secure and up-to-date, the library will upgrade all computers to Windows 11 before the deadline.

Staff understand that change can be challenging, especially when you're used to navigating the current system. To make this transition easier, look out for classes and one-on-one tech help in the coming months. Visit wblib.org/technology for updated information.

Discover new spaces around and outside your library! Visit the Youth Services Desk at either branch to pick up a scavenger hunt.


Community Art Project

DIRECTOR'S LETTER

This summer might find you spending time with family in one of West Bloomfield's beautiful parks, soaking up the sun in Keego Harbor, or vacationing on distant shores. Wherever you go, we hope to bring the library to you.

Library staff will be popping up all over town this summer to provide you with activities, resources, and—most of all—FUN, to help you make this one of your best summers ever. Read more about our partnerships and how we're taking this summer on the road on the front page of this newsletter.

If your summer takes you out of town, skip the subscriptions and use your eLibrary to stream movies, audiobooks, music, and more—see details inside.

I hope to bring you an update every season about projects that the millage renewal is funding. This summer, the Main Library will be closed Saturday, August 16 – Saturday, August 24 so that the Adult Services area and surrounds can be recarpeted. The existing carpeting is 17 years old and showing its age,

so it's time to refresh this active and used space.

Why does the library need to be closed while this work is going on? Think of all that has to be moved when you recarpet your home and apply that same rationale to the library.

We have to move miles of shelving, study carrels, desks, and equipment repeatedly during that time, and the disruption (not to mention the strong smell of glue!) will make the environment unsafe and not suitable for regular library operations. The Drive-Up Window and the Westacres Branch will be open to serve you.

Behind the scenes, the library's IT staff are also working to upgrade public computers, keeping everything secure and up-to-date.


We will bring you updates as they happen, so please stay tuned. Have the best summer ever!
