



# SUPERVISION OF CHILDREN

The Library's goal is for children of all ages to have a positive, safe experience. To this end, all users are required to observe the West Bloomfield Township Public Library's Rules of Conduct.

For their own protection and in accordance with local township ordinance\*, **young children may not be left unattended in the library. The library staff is not responsible for providing supervision and cannot act in loco parentis.** Children under the age of eleven (11) years old must be accompanied by a Responsible Adult Caregiver, age eighteen (18) years or older, who supervises the child in accordance with the age ranges defined below. Persons under the age of 18, including siblings and babysitters, are not able to serve as caregivers.

Children ages birth to seven (7) years should be in direct supervision of the Responsible Adult Caregiver at all times. The Responsible Adult Caregiver should be within sight and conversation distance at all times. The Responsible Adult Caregiver is expected to supervise the child and ensure that the child's behavior is not disturbing to other patrons.

Children between the ages of eight (8) and ten (10) years may use the library independently, so long as they are accompanied by a Responsible Adult Caregiver. The Responsible Adult Caregiver may not leave the library, should be readily accessible to the child at all times, and remains responsible for the safety and behavior of the child.

Children ages eleven (11) and older may use the library unaccompanied by an Adult Caregiver. The child must be able to promptly contact an Adult Caregiver if requested by Library staff. Parents or legal guardians, not library employees, are responsible for the safety, comfort, and behavior of their children in the library, whether or not the parent or legal guardian is present.

It is recommended that unattended children over the age of eleven (11) years old spend no more than 2 hours in the library at a single time. After 6:00 p.m., it is strongly recommended that all children be accompanied by an adult who remains in the library to provide direct supervision. The extent to which this policy and/or these time limit guidelines will be enforced will be based on the individual child's behavior, the child's safety and welfare, and their ability to observe the Rules of Conduct. The Library expects parental cooperation in meeting this policy and these guidelines.

Library employees cannot be responsible for children who are unattended or demonstrating inappropriate behavior. Failure to comply may result in the West Bloomfield Township Police Department charging the parent or legal guardian with child abandonment under the West Bloomfield Township Code of Ordinances, Chapter 15, Article III, Section 15 – 56, Abandonment of Children and/or suspension of library privileges. Persons who fail to comply with the Rules of Conduct may be required to leave the building. The West Bloomfield Township Police Department may be called to assist if a person asked to leave fails to comply or if a child's parent or caregiver cannot be located or reached.

The responsibility of use and viewing of library materials and resources by children rests solely with their parents or legal guardians. Library employees will not restrict access to materials based on age or monitor computer usage.

**AFTER LIBRARY CLOSING:** Parents or caregivers are responsible for ensuring that their child is picked up by the time the library closes. All patrons must exit the building at closing. Library employees are not able to stay late to supervise children who have not been picked up. Children who are not picked up at closing at the Main Library will be brought to the police station to wait for their ride. The police will be called for children who are not picked up at closing at the Westacres Branch.

**\*Township Ordinance Chapter 15: Offenses/Article III: Offenses Against the Person**

**Sec. 15-56. - Abandonment of children.**

**It shall be unlawful for any person, parent, guardian, custodian, or anyone else to whose care children under eleven (11) years of age are entrusted, to leave, neglect or abandon the children in any public place or in a parked motor vehicle in any public place or place open to the public without furnishing someone over the age of seventeen (17) years for supervision of the children.**
